- Full service police department independent from Seattle PD
- Open 24/7, 365 days a year
- 100% of Officers have attended the 40 hours Crisis Intervention Training (State only requires 8 hours)
- All Officers are equipped with Tasers and less lethal force options
- All marked patrol vehicles are equipped with recording devices
- Three K-9 units are all Bomb/Explosive detection
- UWPD Crime Victim Advocate
- Full-time Community Engagement Officer
- Only triple accredited law enforcement agency in Washington State
 - WASPC (State)
 - CALEA (National)
 - IACLEA (International)

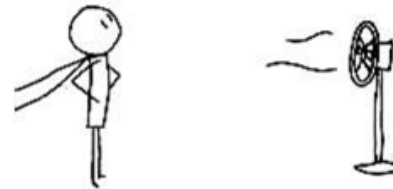
Personal Safety

>**Show confidence** - be aware and in control. Body language works.

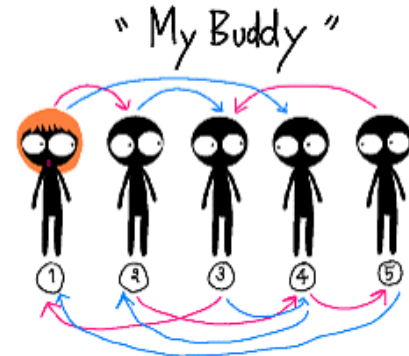

Financial Security & Identity Theft

Scams, Phishing, and

> No law enforcement agency calls individuals seeking payment for fees over the phone nor do they accept gift cards as payment for such fees.

> No law enforcement agency calls individuals and demands money under any circumstances or threaten to arrest or deport you for not paying.

> Do not willingly give up your personal information to anyone over a phone conversation or email. Do not open attachments!

- > Lock or secure it properly
- > Report suspicious activity

Protect Your Property

Residence / Office Safety

- > Lock the door to your residence / office when you leave.
- > Secure valuables out of sight.
- > Be aware of 'piggybacking' – unauthorized access.
- > Report all suspicious activities to UW Police.





Protect Your Property

Vehicles

- > Remove insurance & registration documents from glovebox.
- > Remove garage door opener.
- > Lock vehicle doors and roll up windows when you leave.
- > Remove valuables or conceal them in the trunk.

Best Practices at the Racks

- Use a U-Lock with a chain lock.
- Lock both wheels to the frame and the rack with the chain lock.
- Lock the wheel without quick release to the frame and the rack.
- Never use a cable lock alone. Seriously...it's bound to get stolen.

Laws on Campus

Bike Safety & Camping/Trespassing

>Bike Shares (Limebike)

–You must obey traffic laws and you may be stopped for riding without a helmet.

>Camping (WAC 478-136-030)

–Prohibited on campus.

>Smoking (Tobacco 18+; Marijuana 21+)

–Marijuana is legal in the state of Washington; however prohibited on campus.

–Referral to Student Conduct or be fined. Smoking in public is prohibited except designated locations.
